This is the main text of this sample page. It contains all the required formatting for a simple, easy to read layout for a conference paper. Consistency within the printed abstract book will ensure your paper has the same look as the rest of the papers, and therefore will appear to be carefully presented.

This abstract should not be more than 300 words. Paper Title and Authors are not included in the word count. The word count up to this paragraph is 84 words.

As this publication will be a simple black and white document the use of color within your abstract is not possible. Graphics are also not permitted due to

- Difficulties with receiving large graphic files
- Embedding problems within packages such as word
- Editing issues when attempting changes
- Quality problems for each graphic.

The use of dot-points, lists and simple tables can be used to improve the readability of your abstract. Other things to improve the readability of your paper could be to

- Always spell out acronyms and abbreviations the first time
- Keep sentences short
- Simple use of dot-points, and lists.
- Limited font styles and formatting. (We have chosen Arial font as it's the most common font across many different word processing packages.)

If your paper contains graphics, exceeds the recommended 300 word limit, or has other significant formatting issues, you may be asked to re-submit it which may lead to delays in acceptance or inclusion into the Abstract Volume. The abstract is to give attendees an idea or brief overview of what you are going to be presenting – not be the sole medium of discussion. We look forward to meeting you at the conference. This abstract has now reached 292 words.
